- 1. Stu Bresler and David Anders welcomed stakeholders and provided the Anti-trust, Code of Conduct, and Meeting Participation announcements.
- 2. David Anders provided an update on the upcoming logistics pertaining to the upcoming Board of Managers election at the PJM Annual Meeting.

Consent Agenda (9:10-9:15)

3. <u>Manual 11 Revisions (9:15-9:40)</u>

Joey Tutino reviewed proposed revisions to Manual 11: Energy & Ancillary Services Market Operations resulting from its periodic review. Following discussion, the proposed revisions were **<u>endorsed</u>** by acclamation with no objections or abstentions.

4. <u>Renewable Dispatch (9:40-10:05)</u>

Darrell Frogg reviewed a proposed solution package addressing Renewable Dispatch. The proposed solution and corresponding Tariff and Operating Agreement revisions were **endorsed** by acclamation with no objections or abstentions.

 - A. Marji Philips and Tom Hoatson, LS Power, discussed a proposed Quick Fix Problem Statement, Issue Charge, and posted amended solution addressing Capacity Performance (CP) penalties. He noted further amendments from the posted proposed solution to change the Non-Performance Charge Rate to be equal to the BRA Clearing Price.
 - B. Lynn Horning, American Municipal Power, presented a proposed alternate solution addressing Capacity Performance (CP) penalties.



C. Joe Bowring, IMM, presented a proposed alternate Quick Fix Issue Charge and solution addressing CP penalties.
