# Markets Gateway/eMKT Update

The Markets Gateway tool has been available in eSuite's Sandbox environment since August 17, 2015. Markets Gateway is the tool replacing the legacy eMKT tool as part of PJM's commitment to simplify members' interaction with PJM. While no functionality or business rules have been changed in the development of Markets Gateway, new security controls will impact participants implementing browserless communications with the application. Interested participants are strongly encouraged to log into the application in PJM's Sandbox environment to become familiar with Markets Gateway and test any browserless functionality. #### Anti-trust:


